# Care Packages for the Troops

Mayfair has begun a new project of sending care packages to the brave men and women serving in our military overseas. These small tokens are prized by the service men and women who receive them. It not only lets them know we here on the home front are thinking of them, but that we care about them and appreciate their many sacrifices. Two sets of care packages have already been mailed out. The first set was mailed to Colonel Kenneth Stone (member Ken Stone's son), serving in Iraq. The second set was sent to Staff Sergeant Cody Deupree (son of Deanna Allen's friend from her time at OU). The next set of care packages will be mailed to Merle Mayberry's grandson. Monty Knight has agreed to keep appropriate items at his shop. Once enough items are received the care packages will be mailed. It costs approximately \$8.10 for each box. If you are not comfortable donating items for the care packages and would like to give a monetary donation, we can either buy additional items or use the money for postage. Anyone who knows service men or women overseas should get in contact with Deanna Allen to arrange a care package to be sent. Below are some items that have been recommended (I called on an old Keywanette friend who has served 2 tours of duty).

## **RECOMMENDED ITEMS:**

- Any non-perishable snacks: beef jerky, popcorn, poptarts, nuts, trail mix, cheese or peanut butter and crackers.
- Any kind of candy or sweets that are not chocolate. Girl Scout cookies are highly prized items!
- Travel size baby wipes and hand sanitizer.
- Magazines, books, DVD's, CD's, games, video games, etc.
